Professor Sourdin is an Emeritus Professor at The University of Newcastle, Australia. She is the author of more than 160 publications including books, articles and papers that are focused on justice reform issues. Her work has explored the use of AI in the justice system and the role of a human judge. Her book “Judges, Technology and AI” was published in 2021. Professor Sourdin has maintained a busy practice and undertakes work for both the Commonwealth and State governments in Australia as a mediator and adjudicator. Since 2014, she has also been the NBN Industry Dispute Resolution Advisor.
